

James A. Nicolow, AIA, LEED Fellow

Jim is a principal and Director of the Michigan office of architecture and planning firm Lord Aeck Sargent (LAS), where he manages a diverse team of designers delivering projects for clients in the Science & Technology, Education, Arts & Culture, Historic Preservation, Housing & Mixed Use, Urban Design & Planning and Interior Design sectors.

A nationally recognized expert on sustainable design, Jim also serves as Director of Sustainability, leading the effort to incorporate sustainable design strategies and features into LAS design projects nationally. Nicolow's extensive knowledge of the U.S. Green Building Council's (USGBC) LEED rating system has made him a sought-after speaker, author and blogger. He recently earned the distinction of LEED Fellow.

Nicolow joined LAS in 1997 and in 2001 became the first member of the firm – and one of the first in the country – to become a LEED Accredited Professional. He was instrumental in the firm's early adoption of The 2030 Challenge, an initiative whose ultimate goal is the design of carbon-neutral buildings and leads the firm's efforts to identify opportunities and strategies for the routine integration of eco-effective design in all LAS projects as well as improving the environmental performance of the firm's operations and workplaces.

Nicolow speaks frequently at conferences across the country, presenting case histories about the firm's sustainable design projects. He has presented at such conferences as Labs21 annual conferences, the USGBC's GreenBuild international conferences, the American Solar Energy Society's conferences, the Living Future unConference and a host of others.

Nicolow has published articles about sustainable design in national magazines and trade journals such as Environmental Design + Construction, Architecture, Building Operating Management and The Construction Specifier. Trade publications such as Architectural Record, Ecostructure, Architectural Lighting, Building Design + Construction, Sustainable Facility and Today's Facility Manager regularly interview Nicolow regarding green building strategies.

Nicolow attended the University of Michigan, where he received both his master's and bachelor's degrees in architecture. He is a National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB) certificate holder.
